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

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EMPLOYEES: YOUR GREATEST ASSET BUT POTENTIALLY BIGGEST RISK

At the heart of good business management is the strength of relationships that you build with your employees. Creating an environment of mutual trust, inspiration and respect is key to delivering business success. Yet for many business owners managing staff is the one role that they're least qualified to deliver.

For small businesses the issue of staff management is even more challenging since founders are generally focused on the day to day running of the business and that doesn't leave much time to develop staff. Handled badly however, employee relations can soon diminish and have a huge impact on productivity.

To get employment off to the best start, business owners and managers need to ensure that they have the basics in place. Before they begin to consider the need for annual performance reviews, objective setting and training programmes, employers need to make sure that the legal platform and basis for employment is as sound as it can be.

At a minimum employers must have the correct employment contracts in place by the time employment commences. Don't leave it and add it in as an afterthought since the law certainly won't treat it that way. Failure to provide your employees with a contract of employment within eight weeks of their start date, for example, can have far reaching financial implications if you found yourself in court or at a tribunal. If the employee was successful in any element of their claim, then the judge will take into consideration the failure to provide a contract of employment and make an additional award of between two to four weeks pay.

While many are tempted to download generic contracts from the internet, be warned the law will consider certain clauses, such as restrictive covenants, unenforceable if the contract hasn't been tailored specifically for the employee or group of employees.

For an employment contract to be enforceable it must be compliant, up to date, and effective. I've seen employers that have recently issued a contract of employment that makes reference to the Contract of Employment Act 1972 that ceased to exist in 1996! Needless to say the contract was defective and didn't protect the business at all!

A good employment contract is worth its weight in gold. It can protect your business from fraudulent activity by employees and contractually bind them to prevent trade secrets and intellectual property being shared or stolen. The contract can also look to restrict employee activities after they've left the company if that is likely to cause conflict. Restrictive covenant clauses can prevent employees moving directly to a competitor and taking business information, such as new business target lists or even business plans with them. They can also restrict employees' ability to set up on their own by taking existing clients with them. Non dealing clauses can go as far as preventing ex-employees for courting potential clients.

And it's not just employment contracts that are vital in the day to day management of staff. Employers must also consider the importance of the policies and procedures that need to be in place to protect staff and the business from everything from health and safety threats, to equal opportunities and discrimination.

While the benefits are undeniable, we understand that ensuring that your employment processes are effective is an administrative burden and a challenge to most employers' resources. That's why we launched SAS Protect and HR Solutions to help businesses manage their legal employment requirements more easily.

Not acting until you have to is undoubtedly a risky strategy and one that more than often can end up in front of a judge. Keep things simple but ensure that you're protected. That way you can focus on building and developing staff relationships that will benefit the business into the future.

The Chancellor delivered his second budget of 2015 in July and the key points for business owners are

Business measures

- The rate of corporation tax will be reduced to 19% from April 2017, and to 18% from April 2020.
- The NIC Employment Allowance will increase to £3,000 from April 2016.
- The Annual Investment Allowance will become £200,000 from 1 January 2016.

Personal measures

- The personal allowance will rise to £11,000 in 2016/17, and to £12,500 by 2020.
- The way dividends are taxed will change substantially from April 2016.
 There will be a new £5,000 dividend allowance. Dividends received above this allowance will be taxed at 7.5% (basic rate taxpayers), 32.5% (higher rate tax payers), 38.1% (additional rate tax payers).
- Tax relief on mortgage interest payments for buy-to let properties will be limited to the basic rate of income tax.
- Inheritance tax changes will mean from April 2017 couples can pass on £1m tax free,

- including the new family home allowance of £175,000 each.
- For those earning over £150,000, tax free pension contributions will reduce from £40,000 p.a. to £10,000 p.a. on a sliding scale.


