

The first piece of good news is that a contractor, Graham Construction, has been appointed to build the Congleton Link Road. The 5.5Km road has been a long time coming but it is now on plan for work to be started before the end of the year and be completed by 2020.

Another success story is that a Congleton company has been chosen to redevelop the Congleton Leisure Centre. Pulse Design and Build, based on Radnor Park Congleton have been awarded the £9m contract. Preparatory work is due to be completed by March 2019 with the redevelopment work due to be completed by autumn the following year.

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
Chamber Golf Day Report 2018

On setting up a small business, often for tax purposes, it is common for spouses to be named as shareholders, company secretary, even co-director, irrespective of the active involvement they will play in the day to day running of the enterprise.

The starting point

Upon divorce the starting point for asset division is an equal split, which can be adjusted according to various factors such as the needs of the parties and more specifically, the needs of any children of the family. The matrimonial pot will include consideration of the spouse (or spouses) interest in the business.

Will the business be able to continue?

Generally speaking, the family court will attempt to enable a profitable business to continue, not least as it is likely to be providing an income stream for either (or both) spouses. Usually, the court will also want to extricate the less involved spouse from the running of the business, as clearly if the personal relationship has broken down to necessitate divorce, it is improbable the parties will be able to harmoniously agree on all aspects of business planning and running moving forward.

The usual approach is for the value of the exiting spouse's interest in the business to be calculated. Some may be able to agree on this, others may require a single joint expert to be appointed. A single joint expert is a specialist who is agreed on, paid and instructed by both parties as opposed to each getting their own expert which would increase cost. This could entail the use of accountants with industry knowledge, forensic accountants, surveyors and/or tax specialists providing expert reports to the court and the spouses.

Splitting up. How will your business continue?

The latest figures from the Office for National Statistics reveal 42% of all marriages now end in divorce. With 5.7 million small and medium sized enterprises in the UK in 2017, these figures suggest divorce could impact a significant number of businesses and individuals.

The experts appointed and their reports will be tailored to the specifics of the business concerned, and may cover issues such as:

- The value of business assets, with deliberation on the effect of realising those assets. E.g. a care home business may struggle if the building it occupies is to be sold. However if the business also owns a yacht, there is potential for sale of this unnecessary item to provide capital.
- Forecasting of maintainable profitability over a future period.
- Identifying anomalies and irregularities in the accounts and trading.
- Undertaking asset tracing, particularly where businesses inter-relate.
- Where the business is stated to be dependent on key people remaining, if this is in dispute, providing an opinion in relation to value the business both with and without the key players.

Offsetting

Once the business side has been agreed, it is then usual for attention to turn to the other assets held by the parties, such as the former matrimonial home, investments and savings. The value that the exiting spouse is relinguishing in the business may then be compensated by recourse to other assets, a process known as offsetting. Assuming this approach is satisfactory to both, the exiting spouse can then assign their interest/ shares to the remaining spouse and resign from their positions within the business. This is subject to dealing with any provisions in the Articles of Association of the Company and any relevant shareholders agreement, particularly where there are shareholders other than the divorcing couple.

Some spouses elect to store money in their capital account upon realising that the marriage is in difficulties, in the hope it will escape attention. This is unlikely to be successful as disclosure of the account will reveal it and there is a duty on both parties to provide full disclosure of their respective financial positions.

Where both spouses are actively involved in the company I have had suggestions that they continue to work together postdivorce. I would usually counsel against this. The likelihood of this continuing to operate harmoniously is slim and substantial disruption to the smooth-running of the business is best avoided.

What precautionary measures can be taken?

A pre-nuptial agreement prior to marriage, or a post-nuptial agreement whilst the marriage is in place, may assist should divorce occur. It will be a document the Judge will consider as evidencing your intentions and contributions prior to marital breakdown. A specialist matrimonial solicitor will be able to help you with the preparation of these documents.

Keep business and personal assets and finances distinct. This will make it easier to disconnect the business as a separate entity should divorce occur.

You may want to consider involving others formally in the business, as this makes it harder for the courts to conclude the business is simply an alias for one spouse and can be considered as such. That said, this needs to be balanced with the potential for others to interfere in the business and a balance of risk exercise would need to be undertaken before this is considered.



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Thousands of drivers every day will benefit from faster journeys thanks to the new Congleton Link Road.

Cheshire East Council has appointed civil engineering company Graham Construction to deliver the Congleton Link Road scheme – which could begin construction later this year.

The 5.5km (3.5-mile) road will unlock key sites for housing and employment and provide a major economic boost to Congleton, relieving traffic congestion in the town centre and improving east-west connectivity.

The scheme links the A536 Macclesfield Road to the north with the A534 Sandbach Road to the west, improving travel between Macclesfield, Congleton and the M6.

Leo Martin, managing director of Graham Construction (civil engineering), said: "This strategically important scheme will bring long-term benefits to the Congleton community. We appreciate that traffic has been a considerable challenge in the town and the link road will serve to reduce congestion".

Philip Cox, chief executive of the Cheshire and Warrington Local Enterprise Partnership, said: "This scheme will support the development of more than 2,400 homes and 20 hectares (50 acres) of employment land to the north of Congleton with the potential to generate 3,000 jobs by 2035 and £13m per year into the local economy."

In 2013 the Link 2 Prosperity Group of local business leaders gathered the evidence needed to support Fiona Bruce, MP to lobby parliament and promote the benefits of the Link Road. In response to the news that the Link Road has been approved, Tim McCloud, Managing Director of TMC Strategic Communications and chairman of the Link 2 Prosperity group stated:

We are delighted with the result. It is a testament to the hard work of the Link 2 Prosperity group, backing of local businesses and the unwavering dedication and commitment of Fiona Bruce. This is a great news day for Congleton and will help businesses expand, increase jobs and move us all a step closer to the regeneration of our town.

The Department for Transport will provide £45 million towards the £75 million project, which will save drivers on average seven minutes per journey. Transport Minister Liz Sugg said:

"We are investing record amounts in improving our roads up and down the country to get drivers to shops, friends or work quicker than before.

This new bypass will not only lead to fewer accidents and cut congestion in Congleton, it will take lorries out of the town centre and improve air quality for its residents."

Cyclists will also get a better link around Congleton as a cycleway and path will be built alongside the road.

The works will start in October and end in 2020. Cheshire East is providing £9.63m and £20.8m will come from private developers.
