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

In March, Congleton High School held its biggest ever Careers Fair, with over 30 exhibiting employers, training and apprenticeship providers and educators arriving on the day to inform and inspire young people.

Throughout the event, all students, from the eleven year olds in Year 7 up to the eighteen year olds in Sixth Form, had the opportunity to visit the Fair to learn more about the many roles within the wide range of sectors exhibiting. Some students were already sure of their future pathway and spent time delving deeper into their chosen career. Others used the event to see what was on offer, be inspired and find where their studies could take them as school leavers.

There really was something for everyone at the Fair, with employers spanning a wide variety of sectors including engineering, public and armed services, finance, hospitality, retail, manufacturing, travel and tourism, insurance and legal. Congleton Cenotaph Regeneration Project

In 2013 under the guidance of Margaret Williamson the Congleton Partnership pulled together a working group to develop a plan for the regeneration of the Cenotaph in Lawton St, Congleton.

The site at that time had issues with the surrounding wall on Cole Hill Bank falling down and being undermined by tree roots, in addition to deceased trees raising safety issues, the cenotaph itself being both tired looking and again being undermined by tree activity. Above all, circa 250 names are missing from the plaques themselves, a situation that could not be allowed to go on.

Planning permission was obtained late 2017 and a fundraising campaign and development programme drawn up. The overall cost now stands at circa £150,000 of which close to £50,000 has been raised from local trusts, organisations and some public donations. The Town Council has pledged to underwrite the balance with the understanding that we carry on fundraising to reduce the cost to the public purse as much as possible.

This allowed us to start work on the project with a view to complete by November 2019 in time for the next Armistice Day Parade

Total success for Total People!

Total People has fired up the region's workforce after tripling its apprenticeship campaign target and securing more than 150 apprenticeships in just 10 days.
