
The best ladies individual score went to Gemma Littler from the Eze-Talk team and the Clay Conservation Award was won by

# The Big Switch Off

What 'The Big Switch Off 2025' means for your business

The Big Switch Off 2025 is the UK's biggest communications project since analogue television was retired, over ten years ago.

In a bid to move the old copper network online, Openreach has recently announced that it will be soon switching off its PSTN and ISDN networks. This unfortunately means that The Big Switch Off will affect anyone who still uses a landline phone service, with a government-backed deadline of 2025.

The firm says that this move is part of an ongoing effort to modernise the UK's telecommunications infrastructure, which will enable them to better support 5G services and provide customers with more high-speed broadband options.

Openreach plans to move all phone calls away from the traditional telephone network and onto Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP). VoIP will not only incorporate features such as caller ID, call waiting, call forwarding and voicemail retrieval into one service via the internet, but it means cheaper and clearer phone calls too.

The project was announced in 2016 and has already started rolling out across the country.

Why are ISDN and PSTN being phased out?

ISDN stands for Integrated Services Digital Network, and was invented in the 1980s to provide phone connections that could carry both data and voice. The problem with ISDN is that it requires a lot of equipment and has limited range—it's only good for local calls.

This digital network also suffers from a high fixed cost per user. Because of this, it's not cost effective for companies to use an ISDN line when they can retain unlimited data usage on other types of connections at much lower costs. The PSTN (Public Switched Telephone Network) connection is being phased out because it isn't as

flexible as newer, cheaper technologies. The PSTN connection uses copper wires to connect people on the same network, but this means that when there are problems with the wires, they must be fixed manually, which can be time-consuming and costly.

More favourable, newer technologies use fibre optic cables and satellites to connect people on different networks without having to go through a central location first. This means that if there's a problem, it can be fixed remotely instead.

What is SIP?

If you're looking for a robust way to get connected with your customers, it may be time to investigate Session Initiation Protocol (SIP). SIP is a technology that allows you to make calls over the internet (VoIP) and is increasingly becoming a preference for business owners who want to save money on their phone bills by routing calls through their existing internet connection.

receiving secure, quality communications from anywhere in the world.

This was a challenging project for us but the reward of seeing so many young people gain permanent roles, with local businesses, made it all worthwhile.

One of our current projects, delivering English classes to refugees, is a humbling addition to our provision. We have students from Afghanistan, Hong Kong, Syria and Ukraine, and we love having such a diverse customer base studying with us every week.

I have so many highlights from the last 20 years and feel privileged to have been a part of so many people's lives, sharing with them some truly amazing achievements. I couldn't have done any of it though without the fantastic team around me.



# New HMRC filing regimes designed to hit persistent offenders

From 01 January 2023 HMRC are introducing two new penalty regimes for VAT customers. The penalties will affect ITSA customers from 2024.

### Late Submission Penalties

Every time a business fails to submit a VAT return, they will get a point. Once they hit their penalty threshold (2 points for annual returns, 4 points for quarterly returns and 5 points for monthly returns), they will receive a fine of £200. Every subsequent late return will incur another £200 fine.

Points will expire after two years and reset to zero. But, if at the penalty threshold, taxpayers must demonstrate a period of compliance to reset their points.

### To do this they must:

- · Submit all returns on time for a set time period (24 months for annual returns, 12 months for quarterly returns and 6 months for monthly returns)
- · Submit all returns for the preceding twenty-four months (even if late).

Both conditions must be met for the points to be reset.

HMRC say this will be kinder to people who make a one-off mistake, whilst penalising persistent offenders.

### Late Payment Penalties

Basically, the sooner you pay the lower the penalty rate will be.

### First Penalty

No penalty if payment is made within 15 days of the due date. Day 15 - penalty is 2% of the amount outstanding. Day 30 - penalty becomes 2% of the amount outstanding at day 15 PLUS 2% of the amount outstanding at day 30.

### Additional or Second Penalty

Day 31 - daily penalty of 4% per annum of the outstanding amount. This will only stop when the outstanding balance is paid.

### Soft Landing Period

No penalty will be charged between 01 January 2023 and 31 December 2023, IF the amount due is paid in full within 30 days of the payment due date.

### Time to Pay Arrangements

If a time to pay arrangement is agreed with HMRC, the penalty will stop accruing, but only if the terms of the TTP agreement are honoured.



# Major tax changes are coming...

A number of major tax changes are coming which will change how small businesses and landlords structure their affairs and pay tax.

### **Associated companies**

If you have more than one company, the additional companies may mean you pay more corporation tax on each company's profits from April 2023.

### **Basis period reform**

The rules for taxing the profits of sole traders and partnerships with a year-end other than 31 March will change. Most will pay more tax in 2023-24.

### Making tax digital

HMRC propose that almost all landlords and sole traders will be required to file quarterly tax returns from accounting software from April 2024.

### What Are Today and Tomorrow's Challenges?




