





#### What motivates you?

My main motivator is to continue to grow our business alongside my brother, to make all of our hard work over the past 21 years worthwhile, to provide a secure and comfortable future for my family who mean the world to me.

#### How many hours do you work a day on average?

I don't necessarily count how many hours I do in a typical week but as I'm sure most business owners would agree you never really switch off and will find yourself responding to the needs of the business anytime of the day! I am lucky that I can be flexible with the hours I work so I can be there for my 2 daughters and get to do the school run and attend events that they may be taking part in.

#### What have you found to be the most satisfying moment in business?

Back in 2019 when Mike (Brother) and I became directors of the business, we had both worked so hard to build and get the business to where it is today and continue to do so. I think this is why we work so well together (I hope he would agree!)

#### If you had the chance to start your career over again, what would you do differently?

I don't think I would change anything really, I started out as an office junior for my dad as summer job after completing my degree, I have worked in various departments over the years. I see this as a real positive as it has allowed me to work hands on in various roles so I really do understand how everything works. I have worked in and seen changes in the technology and how this has moved on over the years this I feel gives be a good understanding about how things need to work to succeed in such a competitive industry.

#### How do you spend your leisure time?

My evenings and weekends consist of being 'Mum taxi' for my eldest teen daughter or watching my youngest perform on the stage at a local performing arts school,

I really love to have quality family time with my husband and daughters, this often consists of nice walks along the beach when we visit our family holiday home in Anglesey.

I enjoy going to the gym and doing my hiit classes, it helps me to wind down after a busy day in the office.

#### Who has been your greatest inspiration?


My husband and my parents. My husband has always supported and encouraged me to keep going over the years, even when times get difficult trying to juggle the work life balance, he is there for me. My mum and dad who have both worked very hard to get to where they are in their lives, for teaching me and my brother that if you want to succeed you have to work hard for it and finally for giving me and our family the opportunity to continue to make our business thrive whilst being there wherever possible to help and support.

#### What are today and tomorrow's challenges?

Today's challenges are about getting our name out there in what is an extremely competitive industry, we want people to know that we're not like the 'other' telecoms companies who promise the world and under deliver, we are not a faceless organisation, we care.

Tomorrow's challenges are the most enjoyable, they will be finding those new customers and creating that solution that then goes on to enhance their

business communications, this is the most rewarding part of what we do.



#### What motivates you?

I like to set clear goals for myself to work towards, and once I've achieved one, think about the next. For example, I wanted to run a marathon before I turned 30 which is looming scarily closer (October). I just ran the Manchester Marathon in April, so that's a huge goal achieved. Now I'm planning my next one! In recruitment and running my own business I'm always motivated by the next achievement, whether it's the next client we take on or the next member of staff we hire.

#### How many hours do you work a day on average?

I try my best to work a standard working day and to leave my laptop in the office when I go – ideally 9 hours. That's not always the case of course, and I do work evenings and weekends too, but I try as much as possible to keep everything balanced.

The most satisfying thing for me has been taking on staff and training them to do recruitment in the right way. I love seeing them grow in their roles; listening to the buzz in the office and the excitement they feel over placing the right candidate in the right role, it is immensely satisfying!

#### If you had the chance to start your career over again, what would you do differently?

I'm not sure I would do anything differently to be honest! I'm doing a job I love, I laugh with my colleagues every day, and we're growing a business that we're proud of. Everything that's happened in my career so far has led to this, so I wouldn't change it. I'm a big believer in learning from your mistakes so I have no regrets.

#### How do you spend your leisure time?

I love nothing more than a walk in the countryside with my partner and our gorgeous dog Peppa. Apart from that, I love eating out, reading and binge watching a good Netflix series (Bridgerton is my current obsession!)

#### If you could talk to one person from history, who would it be and why?

I'm sure I'm supposed to say a well-known person from history, but really, I'd love to talk to my grandma Anne. She died when my mum was 13, so I've never met her. It would be great to get to know her for a day.

#### Who has been your greatest inspiration?

This is exceptionally cheesy but I'm going to have to say my dad. He's probably the most determined and resilient person you'll ever meet. He's taught me my work ethic and essentially that I can do anything I want if I work hard enough. He's also the person that suggested I go into recruitment in the first place – a fact he's very happy to be responsible for!

#### What are today and tomorrow's challenges?

Today's challenge is probably the same as what anybody would say at the minute, the rising costs of running the business! Tomorrow's challenge is figuring out how to scale the business, without moving away from our values and the reason we set up in the first place – that's a challenge we're ready to take on!



#### **HMRC** letter **SCAM**


We have come across a very sophisticated scam letter which is supposedly from HMRC requesting amounts outstanding for PAYE. Unusually this one comes in the post.

#### What does the scam look like?

We have reprinted a copy in this article on which we have removed the name and reference. It looks very genuine and authentic, with the right typeset and layout we would expect. In fact, the only thing that makes this stand out is the phone number, which has proven to be fake. In this case, even the collection reference was correct.

#### What to look for

The phone number shown is 0300 200 3819 and if you see this on any letters from HMRC then please ignore them. If you Google this number, it will show warnings of it being a scam. If you have access to your PAYE account then, please check this first. If you are not sure, then please get in touch with your accountant who will be able to verify if any amounts are due. These types of scams are becoming more and more sophisticated, so please be on your guard against them. Always check the number on any unexpected request for money before you make a payment. Cheshire East Council has been successful in its bid to secure government backing for two new schools for children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities.

The successful bid means the Department for Education will build two new special schools, located in Middlewich and Congleton. The schools will create 120 places for children and young people from five to 19 years old.

The new schools will support children and young people requiring an education, health and care plan (EHCP). This document assesses a child's special educational needs, the support they need and their aspirations for the future. These additional SEN school places will enable children and young people to remain within Cheshire East and avoid the need to travel a longer distance to go to school.

The first school will be located at Cledford House in Middlewich and will provide 60 places for children and young people with social, emotional and mental health needs. Currently around 25 percent of children with an EHCP have this need.

The second school will be located on the Giantswood housing development site in Congleton and will provide 60 places for children and young people with autism spectrum condition. Around 25 percent of children with an EHCP, also have this need.

Deborah Woodcock, executive director of children's services at Cheshire East Council, said:

"This is great news, as the two schools will provide much needed local places for children and young people with special educational needs."

"Our aim is for all schools to be more inclusive, offering the right support to meet the needs of all children and young people."

"By doing this, children can attend a local school, reducing the pressure on school transport costs and our high needs dedicated school grant. Both of these are currently overspent due to the increase in demand and lack of local provision."

"We know that having the right school for all children and young people is key to supporting them to achieve their potential and help them to develop the range of skills and experiences they need to equip them for adulthood." "Alongside the Department for Education, we are now seeking proposals from organisations which are interested in establishing and running the new schools."

The next stage in the process is to advertise the opportunity for trusts to apply to establish the new schools. Government guidance states that the final decision to open any free school depends on the Secretary of State formally entering into a funding agreement with the chosen academy trust.






